Learning outcomes

On completing the **Master in Ancient Languages and Literatures : Classics**, students :

- will have mastered techniques for the philological analysis of Greek and Latin texts (textual criticism ; grammatical analysis; literary interpretation; intertextual comparison);
- will have active competence in the two classical languages through regular practice in translation;
- will have developed in-depth knowledge in the field of the history of the language, literature and classical civilisations;
- will be able to employ techniques for the comparative study of linguistics, literature and culture;
- will demonstrate ability to set out the results of personal research in clear and correct language in line with the academic methodology being used.

In addition, depending on the focus selected, students :

- * will have received training in academic research in the area of classical philology;
- * will have acquired the teaching skills necessary to teach Greek and Latin;
- * will have gained professional skills in the field of library studies.

Teaching method

The different pathways offered in the programme (focuses and many options) give the student the chance to gear his training towards his skills and interests and thus acquire relative autonomy in his training. The different modules on the programme offer a coherent set of courses.

Most courses on the programme implement interactive pedagogy, inspired by the project "gérer sa formation" or "manage your training" (student autonomy guaranteed thanks to new ICT resources , e-learning, teaching teams, practice of oral and written communication, etc). The programme familiarises the student with new resources and methods.

Evaluation

Written and oral exams measure knowledge acquired as well as the student's know-how and communication skills. Some subjects, geared towards the development of research skills and personal criticism, are the subject of presentations and discussions spread across the year (permanent evaluation).

Courses are evaluated according to current university regulations (see General Examination Regulations). Students may find further information on specific evaluation methods in the course descriptions.

Mobility and/or Internationalisation outlook

If the Erasmus exchanges normally take part in the 3rd year of the bachelor, students on the master 120 can take 30 credits in other university institutions in Belgium (courses in Greek or Latin language and literature can be borrowed from the KULeuven programme, in line with the UCL-KULeuven agreement) or abroad and/or undertake internships in Belgium or abroad (as part of their end of study dissertation and/or focus).

TEACHING FOCUS [30.0]

The teaching focus is concerned with preparation for teaching at the higher levels of secondary education.

The programme is designed to develop the following skills :

- design, planning and assessment of practice ;
- ability to assess practices and their context ;
- understanding of the educational institution, its setting and players.

Three kinds of activities are involved :

- teaching practice at the higher levels of secondary education (60 hours)
- seminars ;
- lectures.

They are divided into two categories:

- teaching practice, multidisciplinary courses and seminars, common to all subjects. They have the code LAGRE (13 credits);
- subject-based teaching practice, courses and seminars (17 credits).

The teaching focus of the 120 credit Master's degree includes the training which leads to the qualification for teaching in secondary education (*Agrégation de l'enseignement secondaire supérieur – AESS*) (300 hours - 30 credits), in accordance with the Decrees of 8 February 2001 and that of 17 December 2003 (concerning the basis of neutrality) relating to the initial training of teachers at the higher levels of secondary education in the French Community in Belgium.

These 30 credits also make up the AESS programme in Ancient Languages and Literatures: Classics which can be taken after a 60 credit or a 120 credit Master's degree.

In practical terms, successful completion of the Master's degree with the teaching focus leads also to the award of professional status as a secondary education teacher. Assessment of the skills in the AESS programme is spread over the 2 years of the Master's degree.

Students may if they wish combine this focus with an Erasmus or Mercator exchange which must take place either during the 2nd semester of the first year or the 1st semester of the second year.

All courses for the teaching focus must, however, be taken at UCL.
