## LAFR2M - Information

### Learning outcomes

On completing the **Master in Ancient and Modern Languages and Literatures**, students :

- will be able to undertake an in-depth analysis of both French and Latin texts, as well as the history of French and Latin literature ;
- will have in-depth knowledge of all aspects of language, from both a diachronic and a synchronic perspective ;
- will have active competence in Latin through regular practice in translation ;
- will be able to express themselves, in writing, using French in a clear and structured way, using specific vocabulary as well as tools for the organisation and cohesion of discourse ;
- will be able to express themselves orally in French with fluency.

In addition, depending on the focus selected, students :

- \* will have received training in academic research in the area of French and Latin studies ;
- \* will have acquired the teaching skills necessary to teach French and Latin ;
- \* will have gained professional skills in the field of library studies.

### Teaching method

The majority of courses on this programme use interactive teaching methods, inspired by the principles of the project "gérer sa formation" or "managing your training" (student autonomy guaranteed thanks to new ICT resources, e-learning, teaching teams, practice of oral and written communication, etc) . The programme familiarises the student with new resources and methods in the field of classical and Romance studies. The options programme foresees training in other disciplines, such as history and archeology.

### Evaluation

Written and oral exams aim to test both knowledge acquired as well as the student's know-how and communication skills. Some subjects, geared towards helping the student develop skills in research and personal criticism, are the subject of presentations and discussions spread over the year (permanent assessment).

Courses are evaluated according to current university regulations (see General Examination Regulations). Students may find further information on specific evaluation methods in the course descriptions.

### Possible trainings at the end of the programme

#### Other accessible masters :

at the end of the master 120, each focus in the Master in Ancient and Modern Languages and Literatures can be obtained in another year of 30 credits only.

#### Teacher training

## TEACHING FOCUS [30.0]

La finalité didactique est centrée sur la préparation à l'enseignement dans les années supérieures de l'enseignement secondaire.

Le programme vise le développement des compétences suivantes :

- la conception, la planification et l'évaluation des pratiques ;
- la réflexion sur les pratiques et leur contexte ;
- la compréhension de l'institution scolaire, de son cadre et de ses acteurs.

Le dispositif comporte trois types d'activités :

- des stages dans l'enseignement secondaire supérieur (60h)
- des séminaires ;
- des cours magistraux.

Ces activités sont réparties en deux catégories :

- les stages, cours et séminaires transversaux, communs à toutes les disciplines. Ils portent le sigle LAGRE (13 crédits) ;
- les stages, cours et séminaires propres à la(s) discipline(s) (17 crédits).

La finalité didactique des masters 120 intègre la formation diplômante « Agrégation de l'enseignement secondaire supérieur » ou AESSION (300h ≈ 30 crédits), en référence aux Décrets du 8 février 2001 et à celui du 17 décembre 2003 (concernant les fondements de la neutralité) relatifs à la formation initiale des enseignants du secondaire supérieur en Communauté française de Belgique.

Ces 30 crédits constituent également le programme de l'AESSION en langues et littératures modernes et anciennes (latin-français) qui peut être suivi après un master 60 ou 120.

Concrètement, la réussite du master à finalité didactique conduit à l'obtention du diplôme de master à finalité didactique ainsi que du titre professionnel d'agrégé de l'enseignement secondaire supérieur. L'évaluation des compétences du programme AESSION est répartie sur les 2 années de master.

*L'étudiant qui le souhaite peut combiner cette finalité avec un séjour Erasmus ou Mercator. Ce séjour devra être réalisé soit durant le 2e quadrimestre de la 1re année, soit durant le 1er quadrimestre de la 2e année.*

*Cependant, tous les cours de la finalité didactique doivent être impérativement suivis à l'UCL.*
