The minor in sociology and anthropology aims to provide students with well-honed analytical skills when it comes to examining society and culture. It gives training in the most traditional as well as the most innovative social science research methods and introduced students to the key concepts of the discipline.

On successful completion of this programme, each student is able to :

1. COURSE PREREQUISITES

A document entitled [en-prerequis-2015-min-Isoca100i.pdf](#) specifies the activities (course units - CU) with one or more pre-requisite(s) within the study programme, that is the CU whose learning outcomes must have been certified and for which the credits must have been granted by the jury before the student is authorised to sign up for that activity.

These activities are identified in the study programme: their title is followed by a yellow square.

As the prerequisites are a requirement of enrolment, there are none within a year of a course.

The prerequisites are defined for the CUs for different years and therefore influence the order in which the student can enrol in the programme's CUs.

In addition, when the panel validates a student's individual programme at the beginning of the year, it ensures the consistency of the individual programme:

- It can change a prerequisite into a corequisite within a single year (to allow studies to be continued with an adequate annual load);
- It can require the student to combine enrolment in two separate CUs it considers necessary for educational purposes.

- Direct access to the Master's in sociology or to the Master's in anthropology for bachelors in political science or human science. - Access under conditions for other bachelors (with the consent of the person in charge of the program) : consideration will be given to all of the courses the student has followed for his/her baccalaureate and, in the event of him/her not having taken some courses, they will be added to the Master's in sociology or the master's in anthropology program (maximum 15 credits).
